As part of the Organization's obligations under DRA Section 6032, we are distributing to you along with this Memorandum a copy of the Organization's current Federal Deficit Reduction Act Policy. This Policy is also included in the Organization's Compliance Plan and in the Organization's Employee Handbook. The Deficit Reduction Act Policy is also available on the Organization's website www.pcenj.org under the "Provider" section.

As Contractors and Agents of Our Organization, you must disseminate the attached Deficit Reduction Act Policy and make the policy available to your employees and managers.
